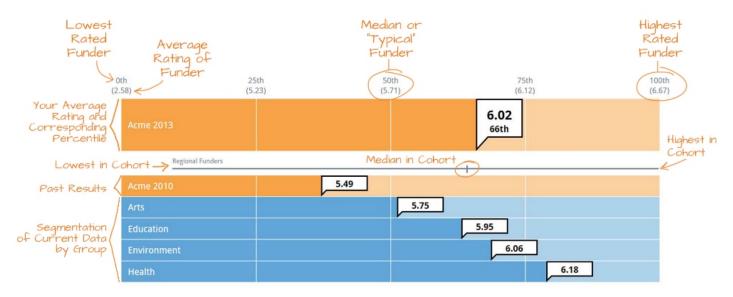

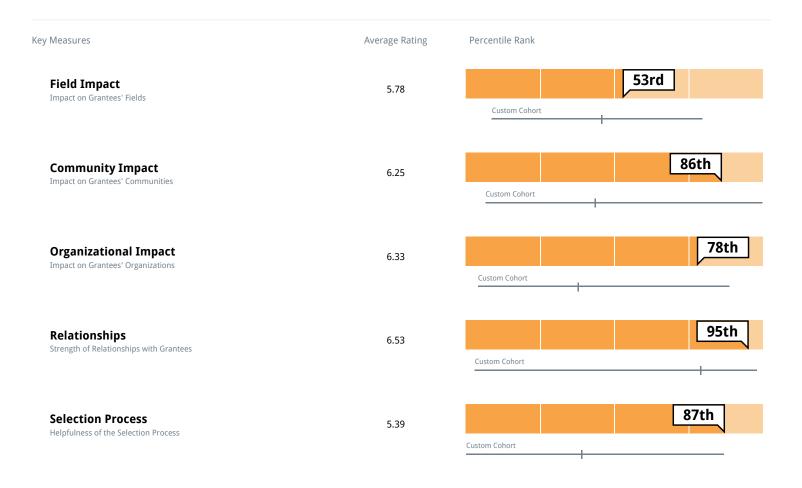

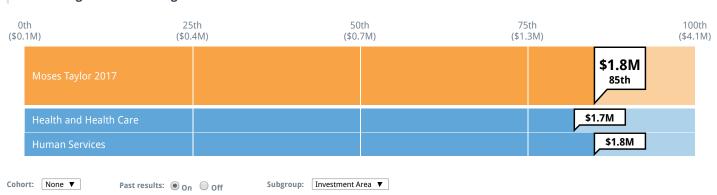

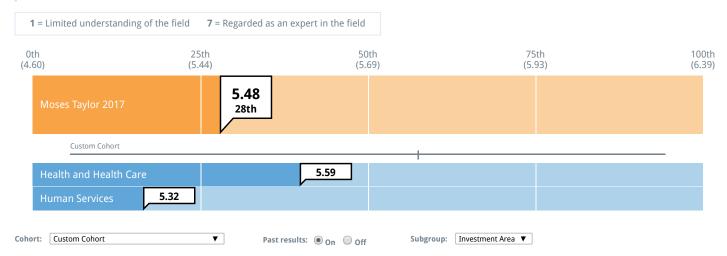

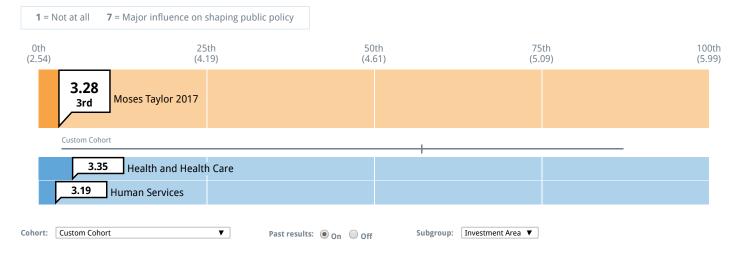

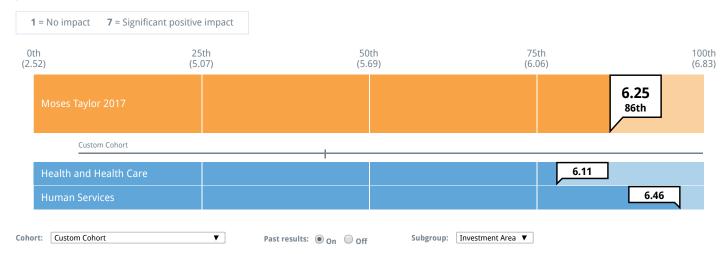

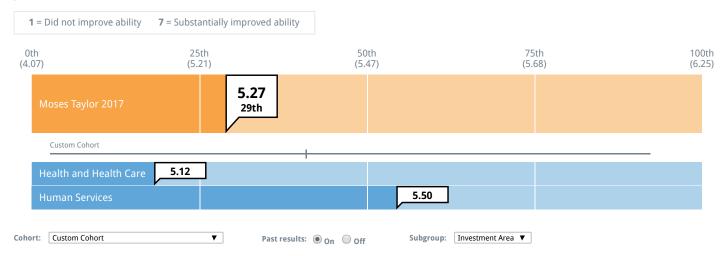

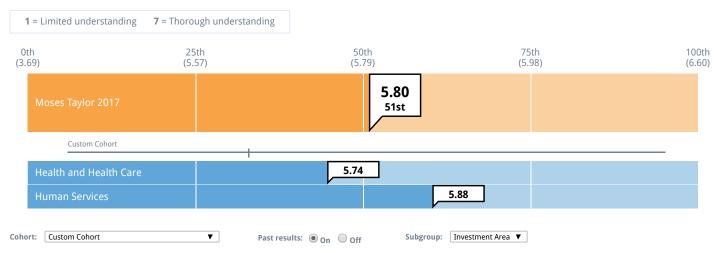

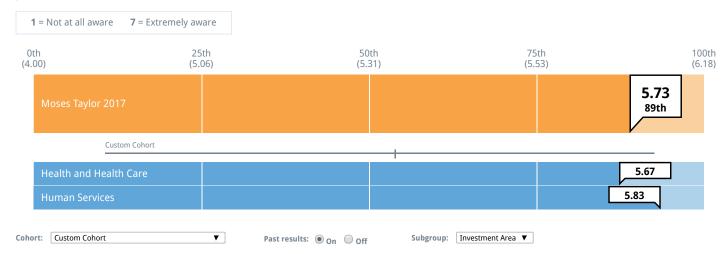

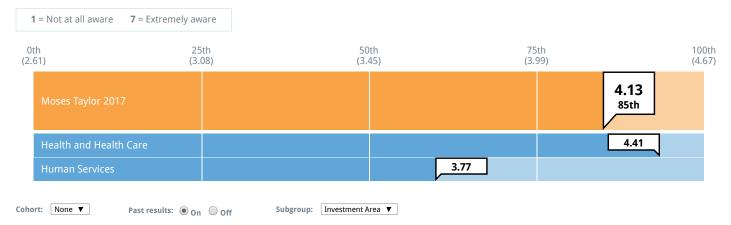

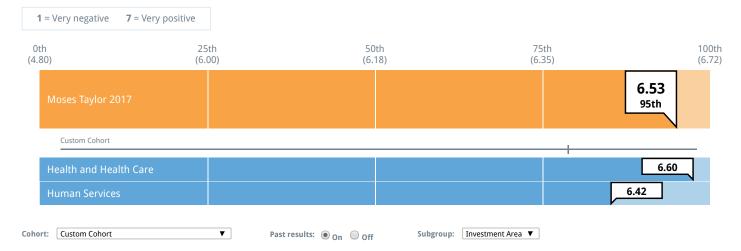

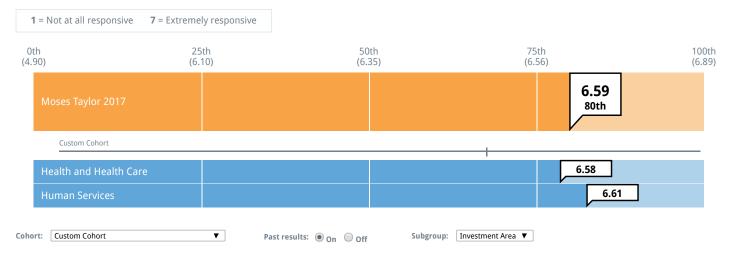

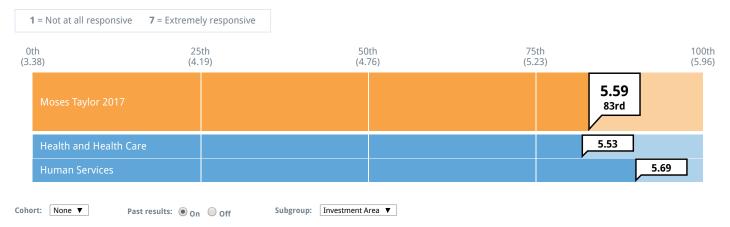

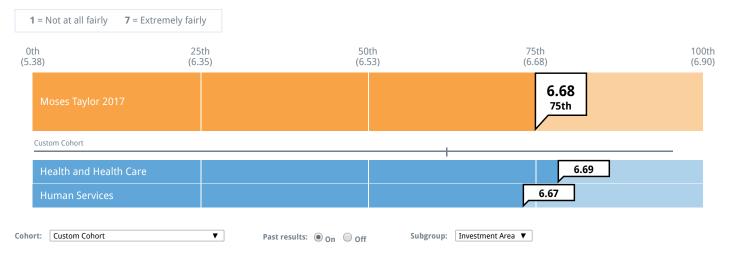

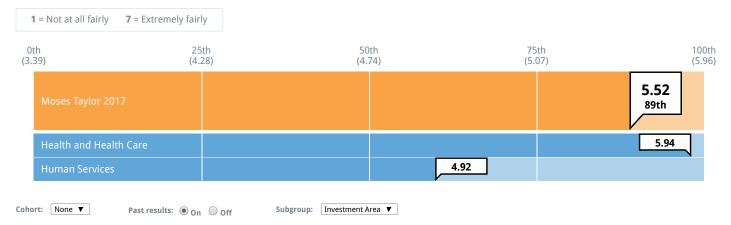

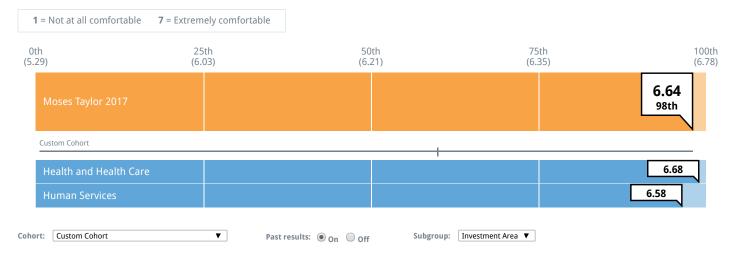

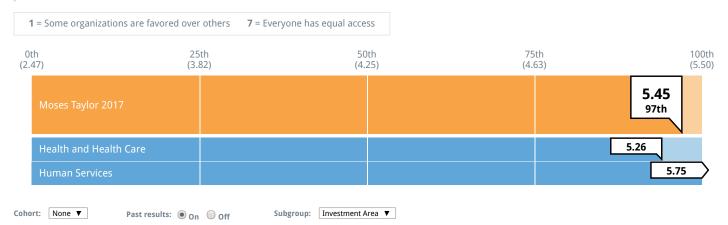

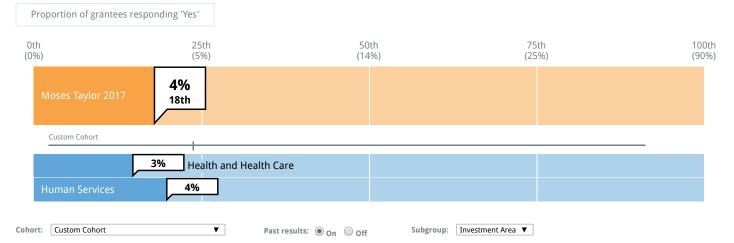

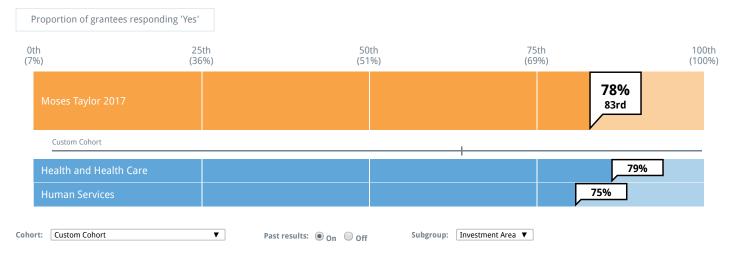

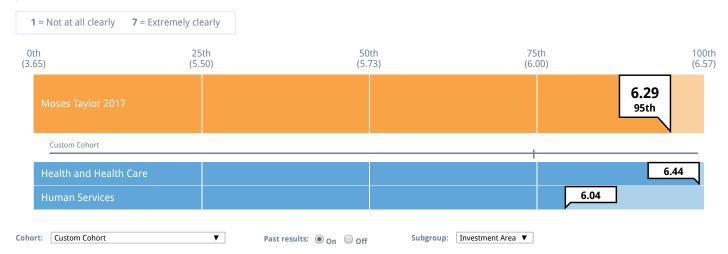

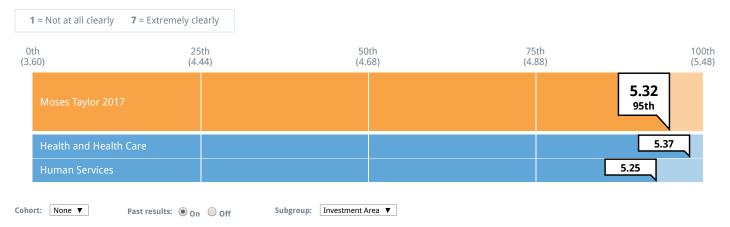

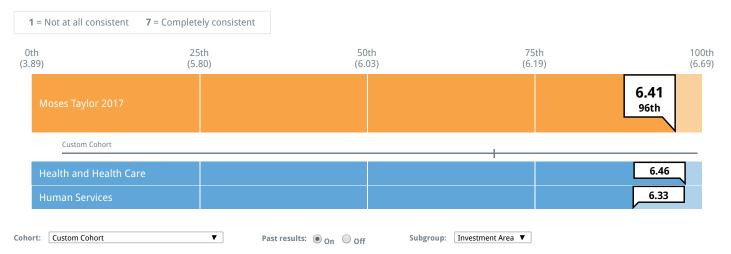

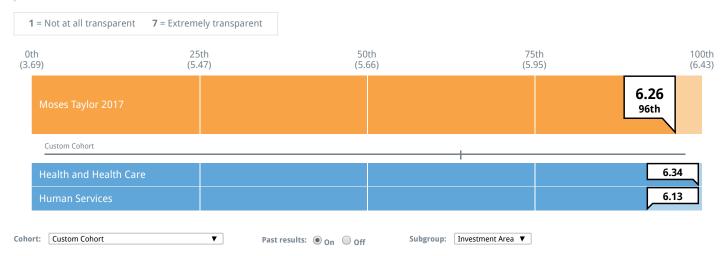

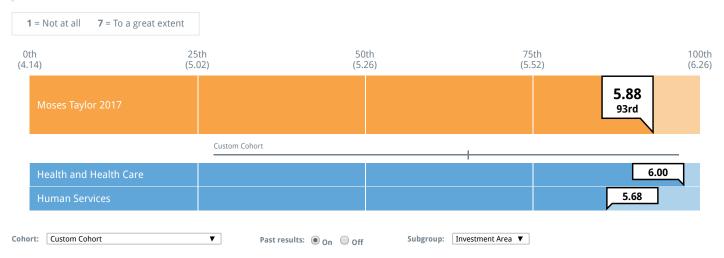

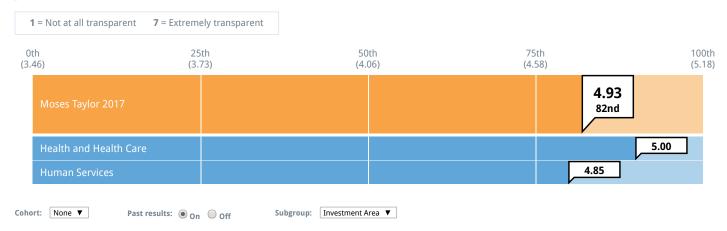

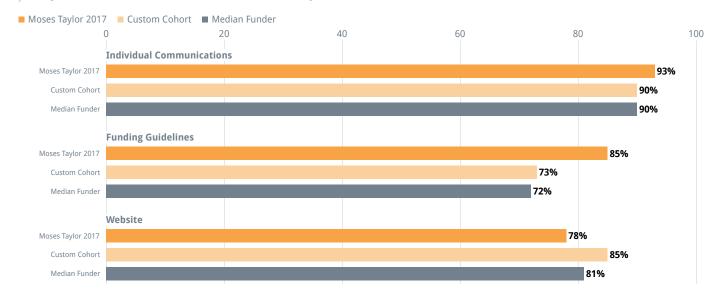

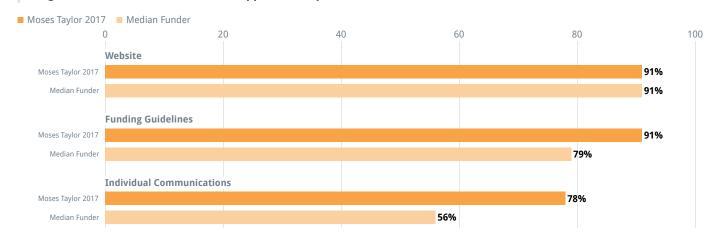

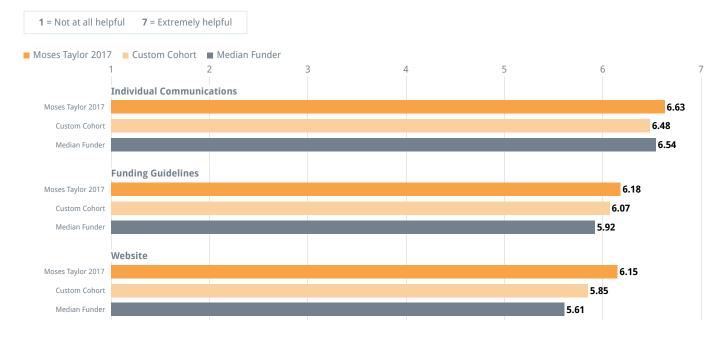
Usage of Communication Resources (Grantee Responses)



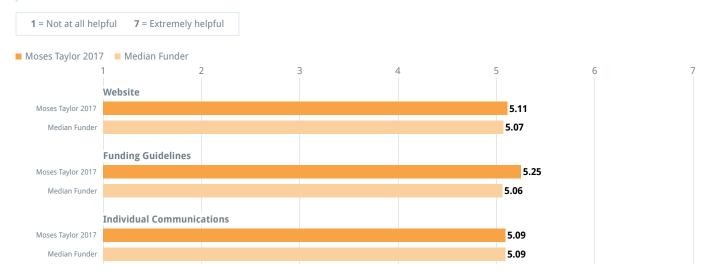
Usage of Communication Resources (Applicant Responses)



Helpfulness of Communication Resources (Grantee Ratings)



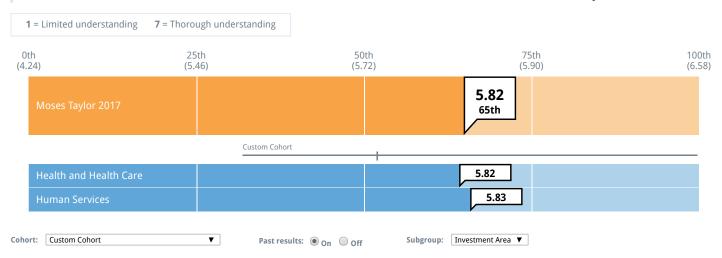

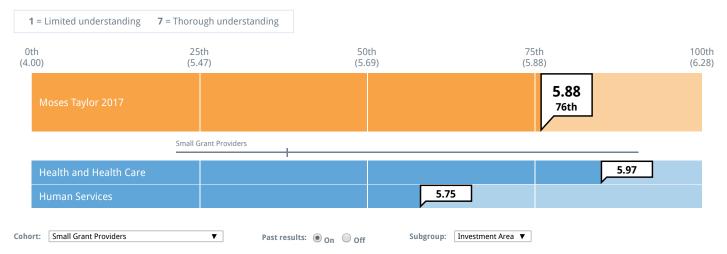

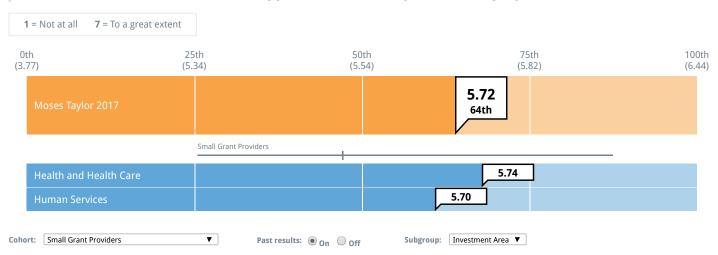

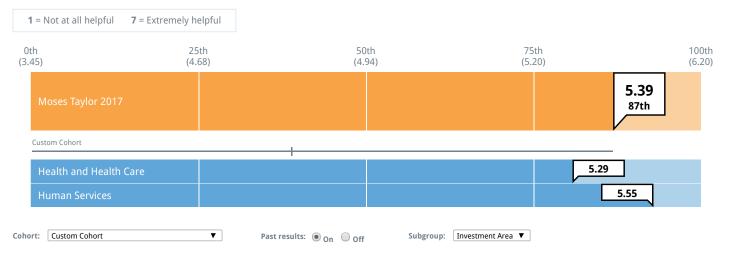
"To what extent do the Foundation's funding priorities reflect a deep understanding of your intended beneficiaries' needs?"

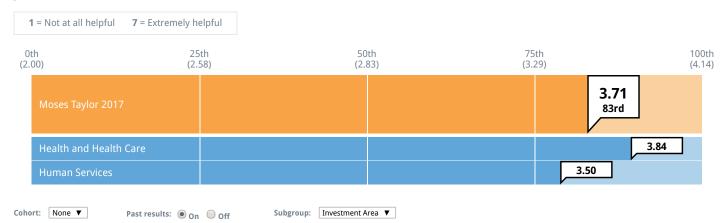

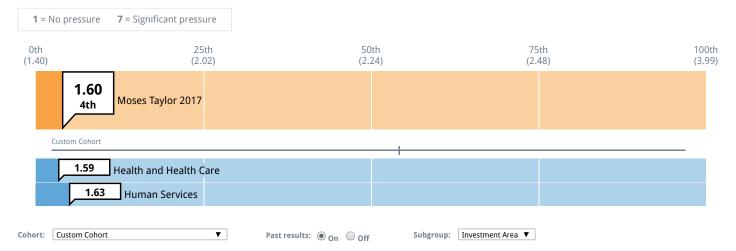

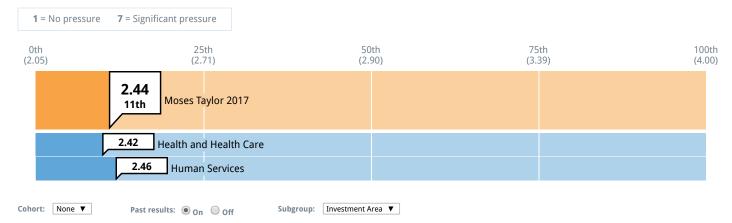

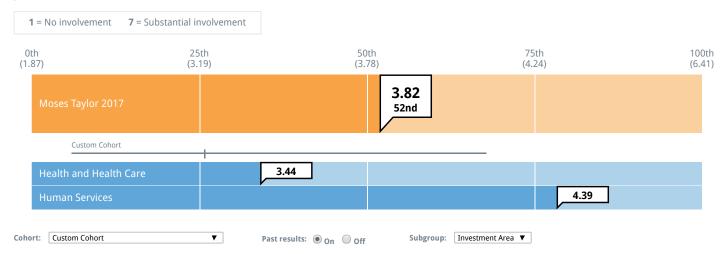

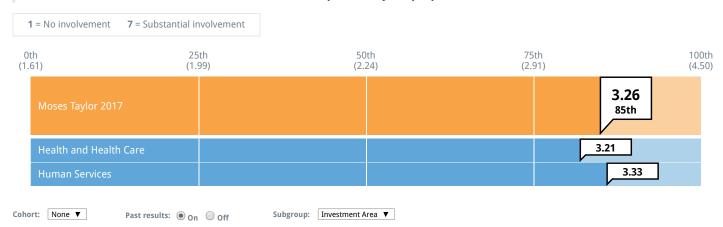

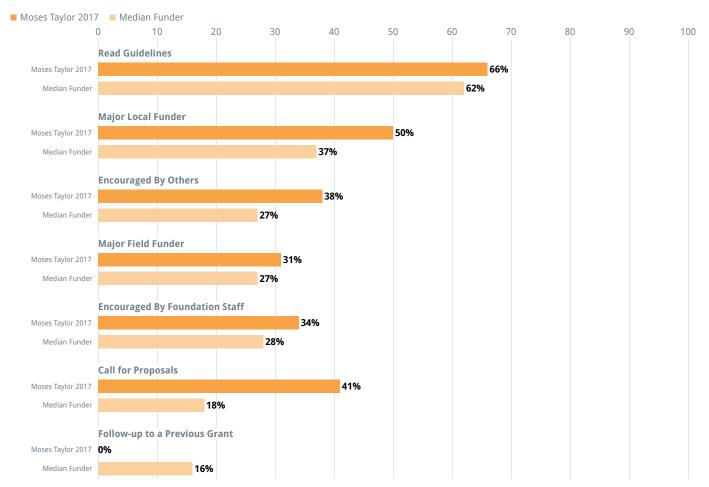

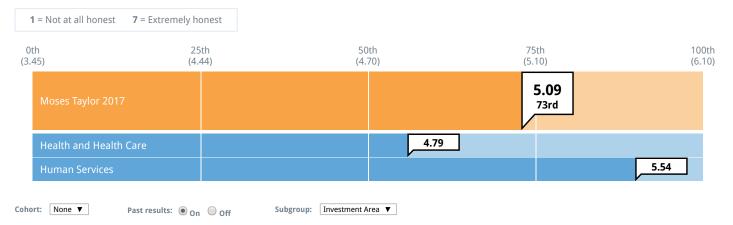

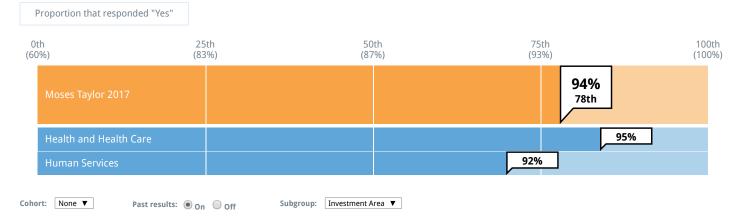

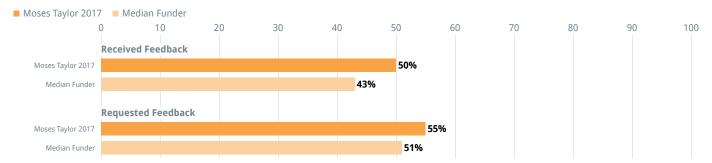

Proportion of Applicants that Requested/Received Feedback (Applicant Responses)

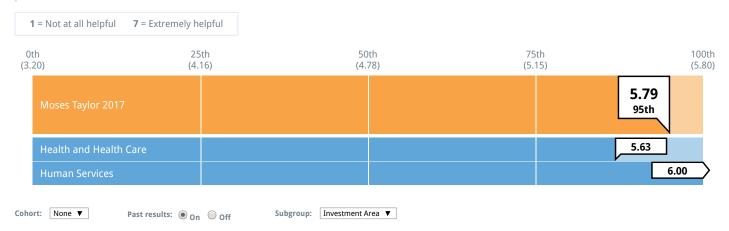


Proportion of Applicants that Requested Feedback, But Did Not Receive It (Applicant Responses)

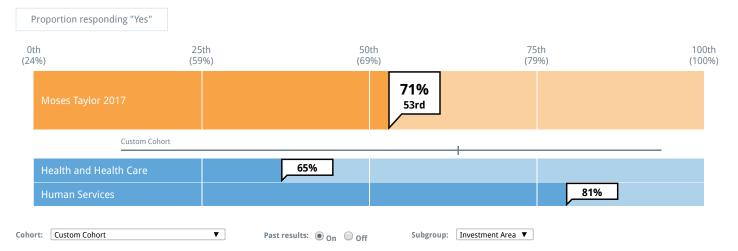

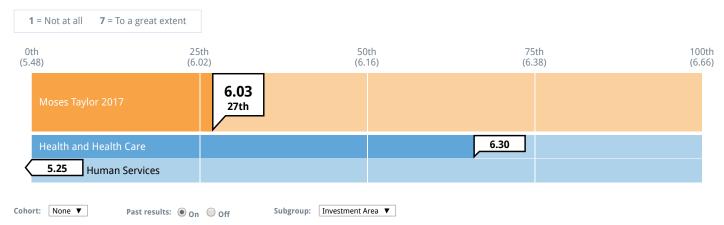

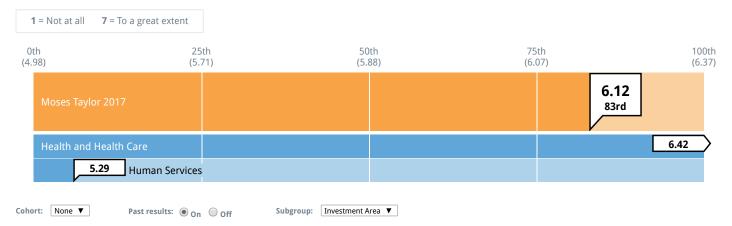

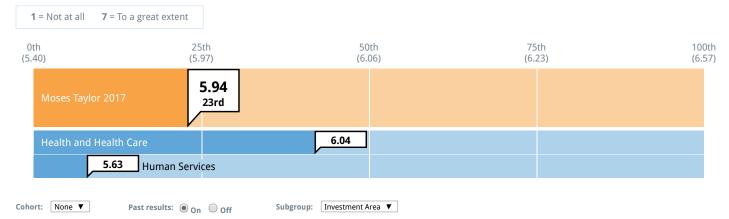

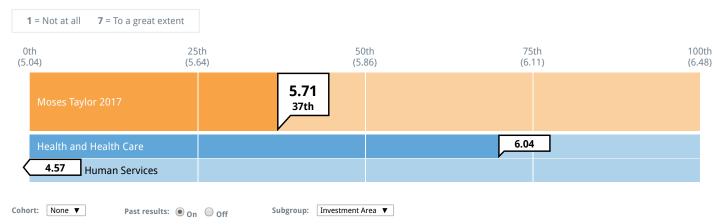
"To what extent was the Foundation's reporting process aligned appropriately to the timing of your work?"



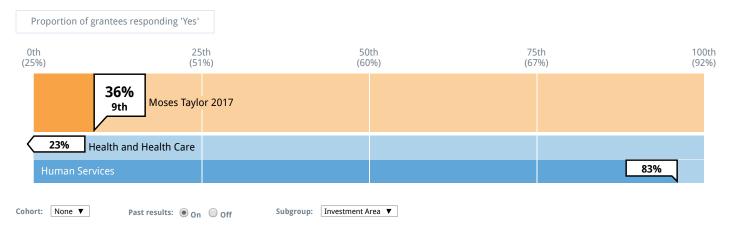
"To what extent was the Foundation's reporting process relevant, with questions and measures pertinent to the work funded by this grant?"

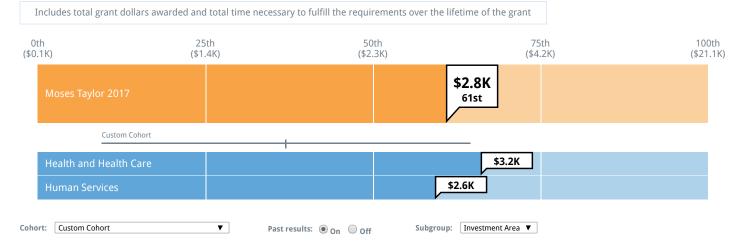

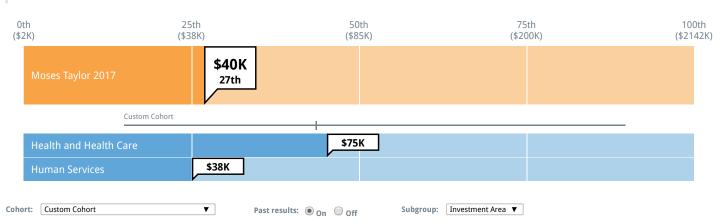

Median hours spent by grantees on funder requirements over grant lifetime

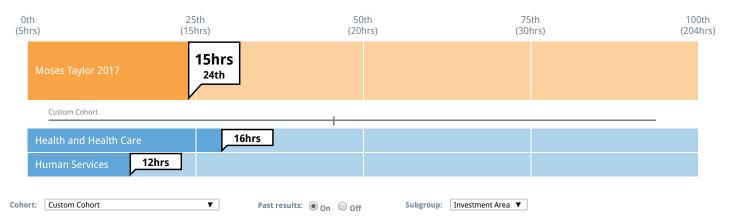

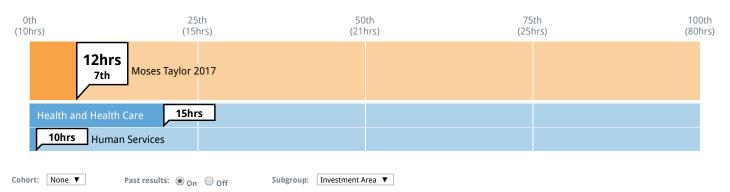

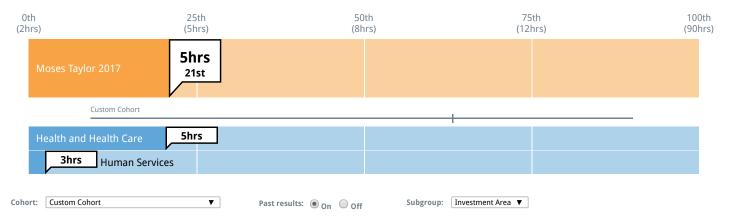

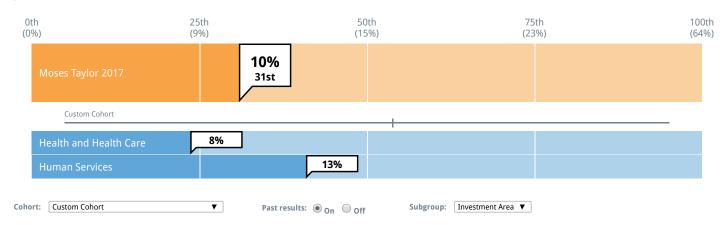

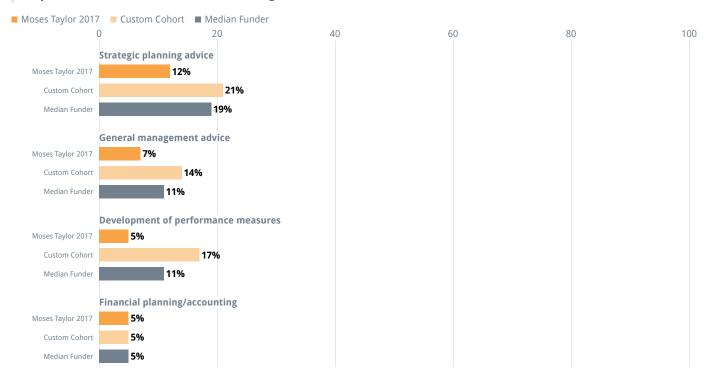
Proportion of grantees that received field-focused or comprehensive assistance



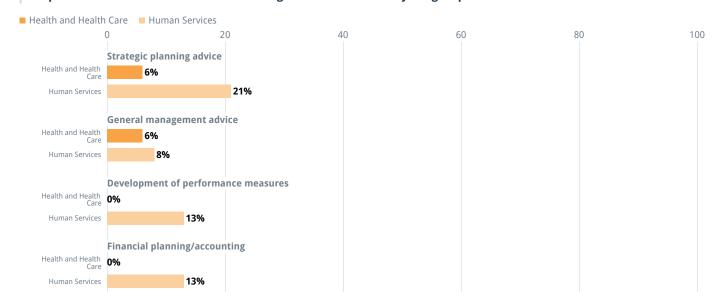

Proportion of Grantees that Received Management Assistance



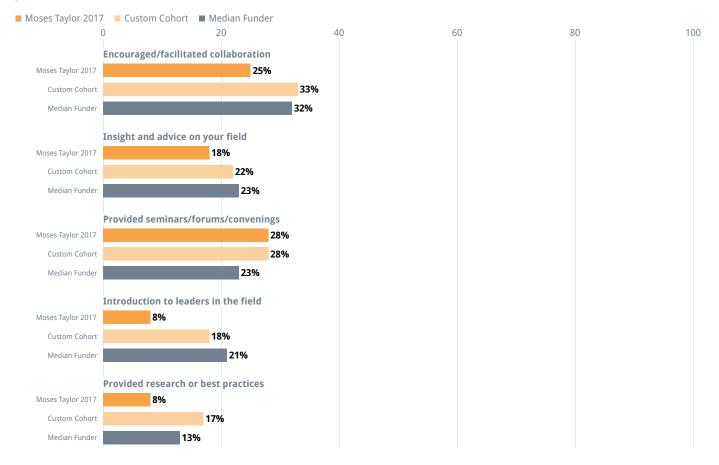
Proportion of Grantees that Received Management Assistance - By Subgroup



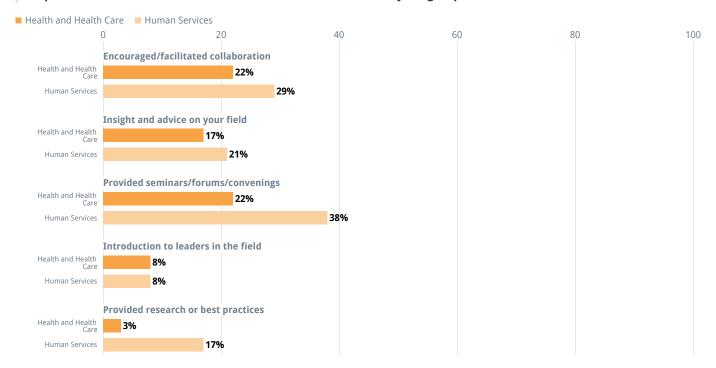

Proportion of Grantees that Received Field-Related Assistance - Overall



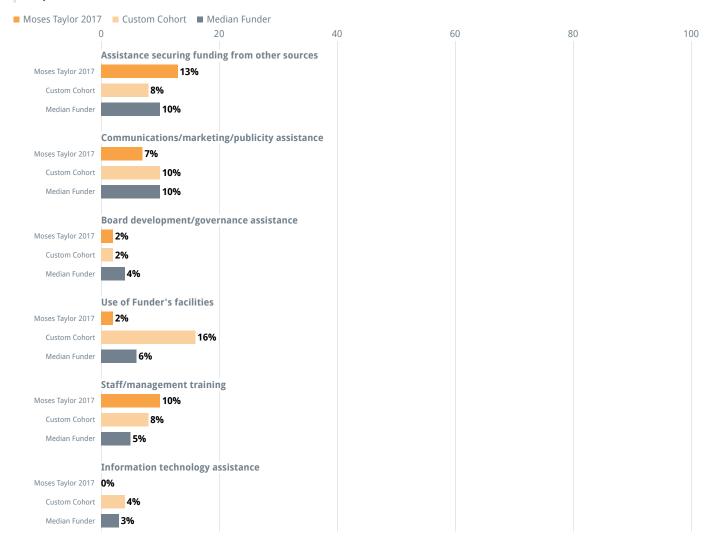
Proportion of Grantees that Received Field-Related Assistance - By Subgroup



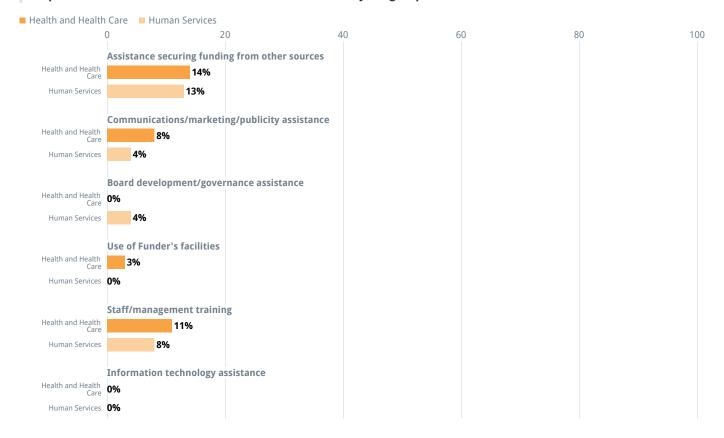

 - "We are always challenged in some way with funding. Foundations that are willing to assist in funding programs for more than one or two years are extremely helpful in maintaining quality, evidence-based programs."

 - "We are...extremely grateful when foundations will consider funding general agency operations, because typically this is an area that challenges us."

 - "Look at the broader picture of how the Foundation can assist organizations that may fall on the fringes of healthcare."
- Increase Involvement with Community Organizations (N=1)
 - "Create a stronger process to interact with community non-profits."

Selection Process (N=4, 29%)

- Greater Staff Involvement in the Proposal Process (N=2)
 - "Meet with the proposer at the time the proposal comes, or sometime before decision-time, to develop [an] adequate understanding basis."
 - "I...would have liked more opportunities to dialogue throughout the process."
- Provide More Feedback After Decision (N=1)
 - o "If the proposal is rejected, discuss [the] reason(s) for rejection in order to clarify any value of a later proposal."
- Shorten Turnaround Time (N=1)
 - "When letters of inquiry or information requests are received, get back to the organization in a timely manner. It took several months for staff to respond."

- Improve Quality of Interactions (N=1)
 - "Sensitivity training for Foundation staff."
- Provide Site Visits (N=1)
 - "A visit to clients' conditions and circumstances."

- "More responsive to unmet needs and less concerned about future enhancements."
- "Perhaps expanding the types of projects considered eligible for funding. Brick-and-mortar projects are not eligible, yet many non-profits have infrastructure needs that would benefit greatly from Foundation support."

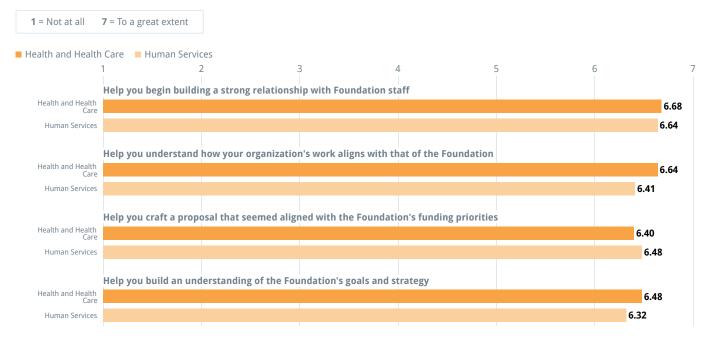

"To what extent did your initial meeting with the Foundation staff..." - By Subgroup $\protect\end{\protect\p$



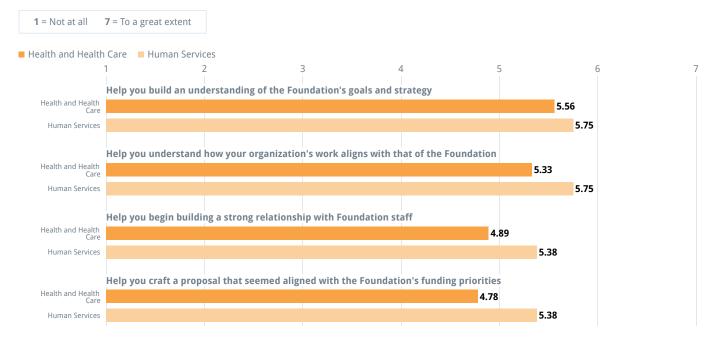

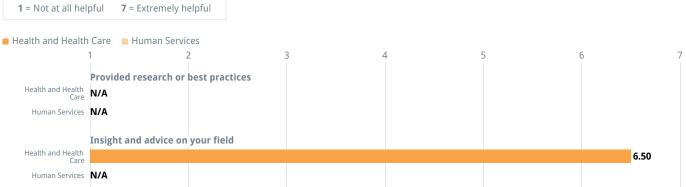

Helpfulness of Non-Monetary Supports - Overall



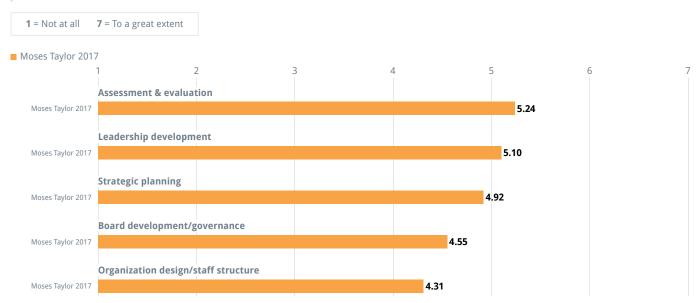
Helpfulness of Non-Monetary Supports - By Subgroup



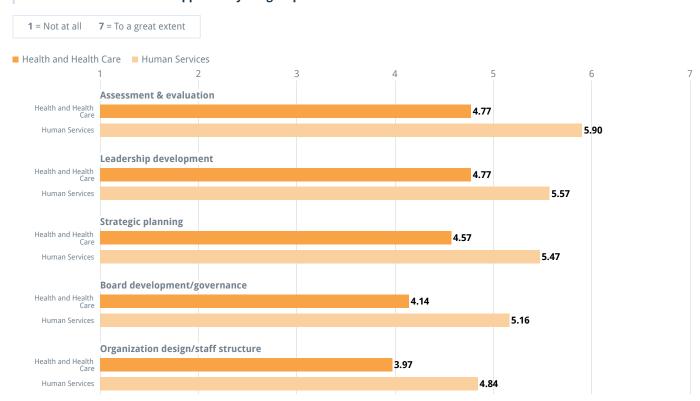

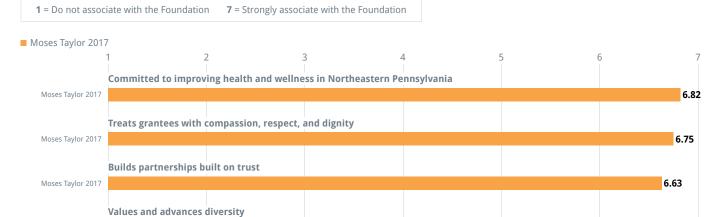

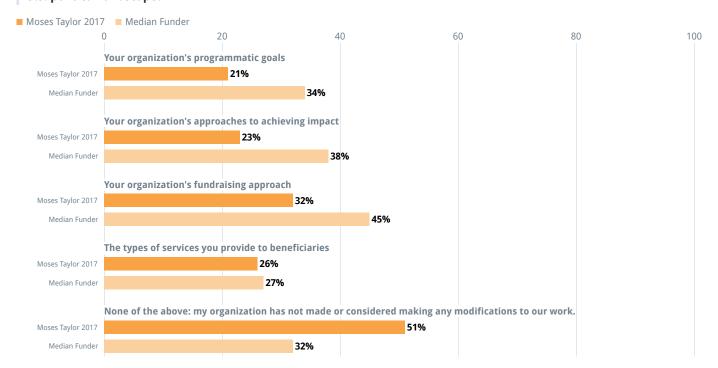

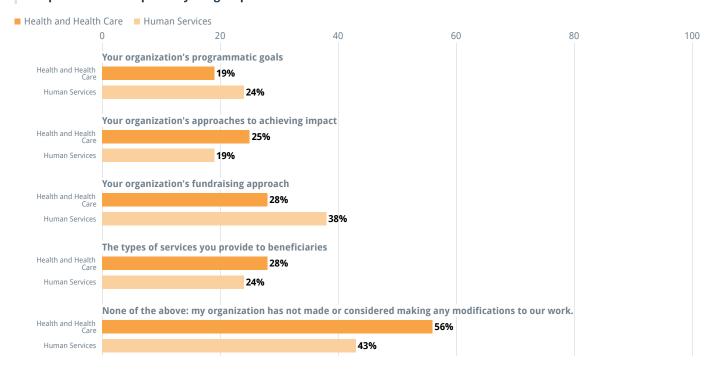

Additional Survey Information

On many questions in the grantee and applicant surveys, respondents are allowed to select "don't know" or "not applicable" if they are not able to provide an alternative answer. In addition, some questions in the survey are only displayed to a select group of grantees or applicants for which that question is relevant based on a previous response.

As a result, there are some measures where only a subset of responses is included in the reported results. The table below shows the number of responses included on each of these measures. The total number of respondents to Moses Taylor's grantee and applicant surveys were 60 and 32, respectively.
